Setting the stage

Contemporary American Theater Festival artists converge on Shepherdstown

SHEPHERDSTOWN - You need to spend time at the Contemporary American Theater Festival at Shepherd University this summer.

That's the advice of no less an authority than the arts writers at the New York Times, who included event on its list of "50 Essential Summer Festivals," right up there with Chicago's Lollapalooza, the Newport Jazz Festival and the Lincoln Center Festival in Manhattan.

Preparation for the 26th-annual festival got underway earlier this month, with a kickoff picnic for this year's 130-member company on the grounds just outside the Frank Center and then the start of four weeks of rehearsals.

Starting July 8, the four-week season will feature five new plays - "pen/ man/ship" by Christina Anderson; "Not Medea" by Allison Gregory; "The Wedding Gift" by Chisa Hutchinson; "20th Century Blues" by Susan Miller; and "The Second Girl" by Ronan Noone.


This year's acting troupe includes Betsy Aidem, Jason Babinsky, Rachael

will be the CATF acting team. Besides festival founder Ed Herendeen - who is directing "The Second Girl" and "20th Century Blues" - other directors for the 2016 season will include Courtney Sale ("Not Medea"), May Adrales ("The Wedding Gift") and Lucie Tiberghien ("pen/man/ship").

Theater lovers can reserve spots now to see the plays and make plans to enjoy festival extras such as free stage readings, post-performance discussions, the "CATF in Context" lecture series offered free through funding from the West Virginia Humanities Council, workshops, classes, art exhibitions, films and more.

For those who don't want to wait for the festival's official start (or who want a night of theater on a budget), CATF offers its Pay-What-You-Can Preview series July 3 to 7. Seats for these dress rehearsals are available first-come, first-served.

Getting the lay of the land

Saturday's free Farm Day gives visitors insights into farming life

"I thought it would be a good idea that we all learn how to be good neighbors to one another and appreciate our farm land," said Tabb, a farmer herself and a member of the Jefferson County Commission. "That's why I started it."

The 15th annual event happens from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday. Visitors can take free, self-guided tours of four farms - Taylor's Ranch, Munchin Hill Farm in Kearneysville and Eversweet Apiaries, all in
