D. M. Albrecht (they/them) is an Adjunct Instructor in Philosophy at Hood College, and at McDaniel College. They received their MA in Philosophy from the University of Wisconsin - Madison in 2017, and have been working as an adjunct instructor since the Fall of 2019. D.M.'s primary research interests are in social/political philosophy and applied ethics, especially reproductive ethics, on which topic they have designed and taught their own original course at McDaniel and Hood. They are particularly interested in exploring the seeing conflicts between parents' and children's autonomy, the influence of culture and social institutions on reproductive decisions, and the idea of children as public goods. Outside of reproductive ethics, D.M. is fascinated by questions surrounding



democratic deliberation, norms of public discourse, and the basis of political authority and legitimacy. In addition to their teaching service, D.M. has been involved with the Intercollegiate Ethics Bowl since their days as an undergraduate. They have both coached their own team, during their time at UW - Madison, and served as a Judge and Moderator for both the Regional and National Ethics Bowl. When not philosophizing, D.M. enjoys painting and crocheting, and is an avid player of D&D.
