

Born Abraham Jakubowicz in Germany in 1920. He's survived WWII, twice a prisoner in concentration camps for being Jewish, and deported out of Belgium because he's a German. Yet—he's the Happiest Man on Earth.

<u>The Happiest Man on Earth: The Beautiful Life of An Auschwitz</u> <u>Survivor by Eddie Jaku</u>

On November 9, 1938, during the terrifying violence of Kristallnacht, the Night of Broken Glass, Eddie was beaten by SS thugs, arrested, and sent to a concentration camp with thousands of other Jews across Germany. Every day of the next seven years of his life, Eddie faced unimaginable horrors in Buchenwald, Auschwitz, and finally on a forced death march during the Third Reich's final days. The Nazis took everything from Eddie—his family, his friends, and his country. But they did not break his spirit.

AUSCHWITZ: A GLIMPSE

"Let us ensure that this terrible tragedy, the worst in history, may never happen again and also, will never be forgotten." —Eddie Jaku

A lone railway leads through barren land. At the end of the railway stands a sign: "For ever let the place be a cry of despair and a warning to humanity where the Nazis murdered about one and a half million men, women, and children, mainly Jews, from various countries in Europe."

Through the opposite side of the railway, buildings stand in parallel. Everything neat and aligned for a place of chaos. The exit to the car drop-offs stands alongside a dirt road. About one fourth of a mile, stands the gate: Arbeit Macht Frei – or Work Sets You Free.

Across the open field, demolitions of buildings from soldiers with secrets, dirt roads, and golden rust buildings remain, serving now as museums, each hold belongings of Jews, Romani, and the like – hair, shoes, suitcases, etc.

Above on the wall – "Those who do not remember the past are condemned to repeat it."

THE DENIAL AND DISTORTION OF HISTORY

"The denial or distortion of history is an assault on truth and understanding. Comprehension and memory of the past are crucial to how we understand ourselves, our society, and our goals for the future. Intentionally denying or distorting the historical record threatens communal understanding of how to safeguard democracy and individual rights."
