# LAND ACKNOWLEDGMENT

The Contemporary American Theater Festival acknowledges and honors the original custodians of West Virginia. We see it as a tremendous responsibility to perform and thrive on the ancestral lands of the Massawomeck Nation. This powerful tribe occupied the land between

Lake Erie and the Chesapeake Bay. We acknowledge these ancestral lands as a gateway of three distinct language families: the Algonquin, Iroquoian, and Siouan-speaking peoples. In addition to the Massawomeck, several other Indigenous communities stewarded this land, including but not limited to the Haudenosaunee (also known as the Iroquois Confederacy), the Lenape (the Delaware), the Saponi, and the Shawnee.

For thousands of years, these lands cared for and supported the lives of countless humans. We confront the painful reality that colonizers eradicated local native groups, taking advantage of abundant natural resources. These oppressors used horrific acts of violence: coerced assimilation, paternalism, and "We are still here. Let's control our history's narrative together. There is much to still be gained in commUNITY. I believe that every voice has a right to be heard, and every person has a right to be seen. Leveraged together, we have the innate power to create a better world."

At CATF, we commit to learning about and advocating for the original inhabitants of these lands while celebrating the existing vibrant Native American culture. Today, several Native American tribes have descendants living here. May their contributions to the region's history and

> culture be recognized and celebrated. We support Indigenous Peoples' reclamation of their heritage and reconnection to their ancestral lands. We strive to use our voices and our art to help right the wrongs of this country's past.

> We believe all land is Native land. So, as you move from venue to venue throughout the Festival, we encourage you to take a moment and appreciate where you stand. Note the importance of recognizing the history that has brought you to this moment. Seek to understand your place within that history. CATF understands that Land Acknowledgments honor the past, present, and future. We urge you to seek opportunities to pay respect to and support the ongoing contributions of Indigenous Peoples.

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



### AN INTERVIEW WITH THE PLAYWRIGHT DONJA R. LOVE BY SHARON J. ANDERSON

#### CATF: Why do you call this play, "an offering?"

DONJA: This play is my attempt to offer representation to Black people with HIV and to those Black people who have died due to AIDS-related complications. But it is not just an offer for visibility and representation, but also for softness, beauty, and love to my community. Because I believe so deeply that the work I do as an artist and writer is spiritual, I would be doing this piece a huge disservice to categorize it as simply a play. In my studies and in my love




of theater, I've never really seen Black people represented in such a way that holds space for a family over the course of 30 years as it navigates AIDS and HIV.

**DONJA R. LOVE** (any pronoun said with respect) is Black, Queer, living with HIV, and thriving. They're the founding executive director of Write It Out! – a playwright's program, prize, and retreat for people living with HIV. They've graced the cover of POZ *Magazine's* POZ 100 issue, *A&U Magazine*, and *Positively Aware*. They're one of *Plus Magazine's* "Most Amazing People living with HIV". They're the recipient of POZ's Best in Performing Arts Award, the Horton Foote Playwriting Award, the Terrance McNally Award, the Antonyo's inaugural Langston Hughes Award, the Helen Merrill Award, the Laurents/Hatcher Award, and the Princess Grace Playwriting Award. Other honors include the Philadelphia Adult Grand Slam Poetry Championship. Plays include *soft* (MCC), *one in two* (The New Group), *Fireflies* (Atlantic Theater Company), *Sugar in Our Wounds* (Manhattan Theatre Club), *The Trade*, and *What Will Happen to All That Beauty*? They're also the co-founder of The Each-Other Project, a digital media platform that celebrates and fosters community through art and activism for Black queer and trans communities, through which they've produced numerous short films and digital series. 


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

#### AN INTERVIEW WITH THE PLAYWRIGHT HARMON dot aut by sharon J. Anderson

CATF: Tornado Tastes Like Aluminum Sting is a title that touches many senses and faculties, but is very puzzling. How would you describe your play?

HARMON: I would describe it as a play about a family who loves each other. That is the core of this play, and love was the most important part in writing it.

CATF: Did you write this play so others could understand more of who you are and what your world is like?



HARMON: I actually did write this play for us - for autists like me. It's an invitation to everyone. Chantal [the child in the play] presents it that way. But I wanted to write a play that in a way privileged our processing and our way of thinking because it isn't in much of any dramaturgy when I go to the theater.

Harmon was a founding member of the notorious gay sketch comedy troupe, Hot Dish! Current Projects in Development: Untitled Mystery Series, DramaDeluxeKenya, and a hybrid documentary with LostNationsPictures called *Commercials for God*.

### AN INTERVIEW WITH THE PLAYWRIGHT PALOMA NOZICKA BY SHARON J. ANDERSON

CATF: You have said, "It's been interesting to me to have this play grow with me as I grow as a person." How so?

PALOMA: I started to write the play in 2019, which now feels like a million years ago. As I have gotten older, I have grown in my relationships and my profession and I've learned a little bit more about grief, loss, and love. The characters deepened because I deepened and could layer onto them more of my personal understanding of the world. The last few years have



definitely increased my cynicism, which was already at an 11. What is happening globally and happening personally has created more in-depth characters. They are not necessarily based on me, but are ways that I can express how I feel about the world.

### AN INTERVIEW WITH THE PLAYWRIGHT MARK ST. GERMAIN BY SHARON J. ANDERSON

#### CATF: Why are you drawn to writing plays about historic figures?



MARK: Because they are interesting to spend time with. The older I get, the more I think that I only want to write about people who have a positive impact on the world. I don't want to write about a character that's despicable. It might be interesting theoretically, but I don't want to spend time with that person. It takes months to write a play and when you're in the company of Eddie or Eleanor Roosevelt or a lot of the people I've written about, you're in good company.

MARK ST. GERMAIN has written for film television and the stage. He is a recipient of the Outer Critics Circle Award, the Lucille Lortel Award, and the Off Broadway Alliance Award. Mark has written the plays *Freud's Last Session, Camping with Henry and Tom, Forgiving Typhoid Mary* (Time Magazine's "Year's Ten Best"), and *Becoming Dr. Ruth*, the story of Dr. Ruth Westheimer. Other plays include *Scott and Hem, Best of Enemies, Ears on a Beatle, Dancing Lessons, Relativity,* and *Out of Gas on Lover's Leap.* All have been done extensively, nationally, and internationally. His play *The God Committee* has been made into a movie. His film adaptation of *Freud's Last Session,* starring Anthony Hopkins and Matthew Goode, was recently released. His most recent play, *The Happiest Man on Earth*, that premiered at Barrington Stage in May 2023, will be seen Off-Broadway this spring. With Randy Courts, he has written the musicals *The Gifts of the Magi, Johnny Pye,* and *Jack's Holiday* (Playwrights Horizons). His musical, *Stand by Your Man, The Tammy Wynette Story* was created for Nashville's Ryman Theater. With John Markus, he wrote the comedy with music, *The Fabulous Lipitones.* Television work includes "The Cosby Show" Dick Wolf's "The Wright Verdicts." Mark is a member of the Dramatists Guild, the Writer's Guild East, and an Associate Artist at the Barrington Stage Company, where a theater is named for him. His books, *Walking Evil: How Man's Best Friend Became My Worst Enemy,* and *The Mirror Man,* a thriller, are available on Amazon.

Peggy McKowen's association with CATF began in 2006, when she designed the costumes for Mr. Marmalade and Jazzland. She joined the full-time staff the following year. As designer, her work at CATF includes: costumes for Antonio's Song: I Was Dreaming of a Son, The Welcome Guest, The Wedding Gift, Not Medea, Everything You Touch, 1001, H2O, Scott and Hem in the Garden of Allah; and scenery for From Prague, Wrecks, and Gidion's Knot. Previously, Peggy was the resident designer for the Obie-awardwinning Jean Cocteau Repertory in NY and the Phoenix Theatre Ensemble. Her regional theater work has been seen at Arkansas Repertory Theatre; Barrington Stage; The Goodman Theater; Milwaukee Repertory; Tennessee Repertory Theatre; Texas, Dallas, and Houston Shakespeare Festivals; and Perseverance Theater. International theater work includes the B.A.T. Studio Theatre (Berlin, Germany); the Teatro Alfa Real (Sao Paulo, Brazil); and the E.T.A. Hoffmann Theatre (Bamberg, Germany). Additionally, Peggy designed the first full-length English-speaking production of The Tempest performed in Beijing, China and the first Mandarin translation of How To Succeed In Business Without Really Trying for the Seven Stages Production Company in Beijing. She is a member of United Scenic Artists 829 and has served on the board of the National New Play Network. Peggy was the featured artist in the exhibition, High Drama: Costumes from the Contemporary American Theater Festival at the Museum of Fine Arts, Washington County and a four-city traveling show seen throughout West Virginia. In 2018, Peggy was named West Virginia Artist of the Year at the Governor's Arts Awards and was recognized by WV Living Magazine as one of the 2019 Wonder Women of the Year. Peggy is also the co-editor of the anthology *Plays by* Women from the Contemporary American Theater Festival. In recognition of her work as both theater designer and administrator, Peggy has been featured in Live Design and Wonderful West Virginia magazines. Production work has been captured in American Theater Magazine; The New York Public Library Videotape for the Theater on Film and Tape Archive; The New York Times, Back Stage, New York Magazine; Wall Street Journal and in the texts: The Theater Experience and Theatre: The Lively Art.

#### THERESA M. DAVIS ASSOCIATE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

Theresa M. Davis, a.k.a. Lady T, is an Artist-Educator in 3-D (Dramaturg-Deviser-Director). In 2021, Theresa joined the Contemporary American Theater Festival as Associate Artistic Director, where she wholeheartedly supports the values of Fearless Art, Inclusivity, and Community. As a Dramaturg, Theresa has collaborated with Geva Theatre, The Working Theater, Penumbra Theatre, and CATF. Tenured at three different institutions, Theresa has taught at Kalamazoo College, West Virginia University, and the University of Virginia, where she joined the faculty as an Associate Professor of Cross Cultural Performance. As a director, she has enjoyed Guest Artist residencies at Macalester College and Purdue University.
