#### A THRILLING AND COMEDIC ADVENTURE


Two queer Hollywood stuntmen navigate the dangers of exposing their love. Based on true life events and told through live stunts, video, puppetry, and cinematic illusions, this story is a fun, raucous tribute to the resiliency of the LGBTQIA+ community. Illuminating issues of identity in the film industry, this play highlights the importance – and danger – of being true to one's self.

Others don't fall like Felix. Almost nobody does, in fact. So flat on your face. So intense. It's a little like love.

LISA SANAYE DRING is a writer and director from Hilo, Hawaii and Reno, Nevada. Her play *SUMO* was produced by La Jolla Playhouse and Ma-Yi Theater Company in 2023 and The Public with Ma-Yi in 2025. She was the 2024 Tow Foundation Writer-in-Residence with Ma-Yi. Her play *Kairos* is receiving a Rolling World Premiere with NNPN. Lisa has won an Edgerton Award, Broadway World Award, and PLAY LA Stage Raw/Humanitas Prize. They've been a finalist for the Relentless Award, O'Neill Playwrights' Conference (2x), Seven Devils Playwrights Conference, and a 2x finalist (one honorable mention) for the Bay Area Playwrights Festival. Fellowships include MacDowell, Blue Mountain Center, and Yaddo. They received an Emmy nomination for Outstanding Interactive Programming for co-writing and co-directing a project with Matt Hill.




#### A HUMOROUS AND INTELLECTUAL DRAMA

Eighteen years after the crucifixion, Peter reconnects with the banished Mary Magdalene. After casting her out, he now seeks her advice and counsel. Questions erupt as they recall different versions of Jesus, His miracles, and His vision for the faith. Whose memories are closest to the truth? Whose secrets are revealed? Whose stories will stand the test of time?

People don't want to think more than they have to, they take their opinions from the most popular ones and follow whoever is leading.

MARK ST. GERMAIN has written the plays Freud's Last Session (Off Broadway Alliance Award), Forgiving Typhoid Mary (Time Magazine's "Year's Ten Best"), Becoming Dr. Ruth, and Scott and Hem in the Garden of Allah. With Randy Courts, he has written the musicals The Gifts of the Magi, Johnny Pye and the Fool Killer, and Jack's Holiday. Mark's musical, Stand by Your Man, the Tammy Wynette story, was created for Nashville's Ryman Theater. His play The God Committee has been made into a film with the same name. He directed and produced the documentary "My Dog, An Unconditional Love Story" featuring Richard Gere and Glenn Close, among others. Television credits include The Cosby Show and Dick Wolf's Crime and Punishment. His books include the comedic memoir Walking Evil and the thriller The Mirror Man. He is a member of the Dramatists Guild, the Writers Guild East, and an Associate Artist at Barrington Stage Company. Barrington Stage named their second stage "The St. Germain Stage."



#### A HEARTWARMING TALE WITH MUSIC

Kevin Kling is a weaver of stories. He is constantly looking for patterns, connections, and unexpected intersections that connect us to one another and to the world. With abundant humor and offbeat insights, with an ode to love and nods to the gods, Kling unravels the threads that have led him to an unexpected destination. There's the trip you plan...and the trip you take. With music by Rob Witmer.

And I'm thankful I was given the chance to rework my own ending.

**KEVIN KLING** is very excited to premiere *Unraveled* at CATF, adding to over 40 years of collaborations with his friend Steven Dietz and, more recently, the brilliant Rob Witmer. In 2023, they premiered Best Summer Ever at Merrimack Repertory Theatre. Kevin's plays have been produced by the Guthrie Theatre, Seattle Rep, Cincinnati Playhouse, Sydney and Perth Arts Festivals, Spoleto USA, Actors Theater of Louisville, the Goodman, Children's Theatre Company, Denver Center Theater Company; Off-Broadway at Westside Arts, Second Stage Theater, and many others. Commissions include the Minnesota Orchestra, Zeitgeist Ensemble, and the Metropolitan Symphony Orchestra. Kevin has been awarded an NEA Grant, Whiting Award, McKnight Fellowship, Bush Fellowship, and two Upper Midwest Regional Emmy Awards. As a storyteller, Kevin has toured the US, Europe, Australia, and Thailand. He is a frequent performer at the National Storytelling Festival in Jonesborough, TN. Kevin has written five books, produced seven CD's, and has performed often on PBS and NPR's "All Things Considered." He is the Minneapolis Storyteller Laureate.



#### A FEARLESS AND FUNNY DRAMA

What happens when the trust we place in our medical system actually makes us sicker? After a series of diagnoses, a mother leads us through her son's search for wellness, a Kafkaesque journey through the world of psychiatry. Written with humor and fury, the story explores the side effects of fighting through illness with the ones we love. In these crazy times, it asks us to question: are we medicating life itself?



LISA LOOMER is happy to be back at CATF after her production of Accelerando opened the Festival in 1991. She is the bookwriter of Real Women Have Curves, for which she received the 2024 Kleban Prize for most promising musical theatre librettist. The musical opened on Broadway in April 2025. As a playwright, her work has been produced at major theaters across the country and taught in both Women's Studies and Latine Studies classes. Her play Roe, about Roe v. Wade, debuted at the Oregon Shakespeare Festival and went on to such theaters as Arena Stage, the Goodman, and Berkley Rep. Other plays include The Waiting Room (Williamstown, Vineyard), Living Out (Mark Taper, Second Stage), Distracted (Mark Taper, Roundabout), iBocón! (Mark Taper Forum), and Café Vida (LATC). Ms. Loomer is an alumna of New Dramatists and the recipient of the American Theater Critics Award (twice), PEN Award, Jane Chambers Award (twice), Kennedy Center New Plays Award, Susan Smith Blackburn, and an Imagen Award for positive portrayals of Latine people in all media. Screen credits Girl, Interrupted and Carmen.

#### A COMPELLING AUTOBIOGRAPHY

Cody tells the unlikely journey of his blended family from Vietnam to Plum Run, West Virginia. In this compelling tale, he examines what it means to be Asian American, to love one family while embracing the unknown, and ultimately to question his own identity. This powerful story proves that who you are is a choice of your own making.

I still have more questions than answers. But I've also learned to reconcile with that fact.

**CODY LEROY WILSON** is a Vietnamese actor/playwright from West Virginia with a BFA in Acting from West Virginia University. Cody is honored to have his play Did My Grandfather Kill My Grandfather? have its world premiere with CATF; previously the play has been workshopped during Pan Asian Repertory's NuWorks Festival in 2023 in New York City. He also debuted another one man show, Halfanese: Two Halves of a Whole Idiot with Pan Asian during their 2024 NuWorks Festival. Off Broadway credits include: My Man Kono (world premiere) with Pan Asian Rep, Handbagged at 59E59 Theater during the Brits Off Broadway Festival. NYC credits include: Prisoners of Quai Dong with Prism Stage, Titus Andronicus and Midsummer with NYSX. Regional credits include: Book of Will, Handbagged (US premiere), and Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time with Roundhouse Theater; As You Like It at Folger Library; Measure for Measure at Hudson Valley Shakespeare. Film/TV include: Hello Tomorrow, Impractical Jokers, Russian Doll, 11 Blocks to Go, and "Gravedigger Pilot." Cody dedicates this show to his family, those he is grateful enough to know and love as well as the family he never met from Vietnam; as a Vietnamese artist it is Cody's goal to uplift the stories and voices of Asian Americans everywhere.
